INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with (a) the 2026 AGM Notice and (b) information in respect of the resolutions to be proposed at the 2026 AGM. Resolutions to be proposed at the 2026 AGM include, *inter alia*: (a) ordinary resolutions on the proposed grant of each of the General Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate; (b) ordinary resolution relating to the proposed re-election of the Directors; and (c) ordinary resolution relating to the proposed re-appointment of auditor.

GRANT OF GENERAL MANDATE, REPURCHASE MANDATE AND EXTENSION MANDATE

Pursuant to the ordinary resolutions passed by the then Shareholders at the 2025 AGM, the Directors were granted (a) a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the number of issued Shares on the date of passing of the relevant ordinary resolution; (b) a general and unconditional mandate to repurchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the number of issued Shares on the date of passing of the relevant ordinary resolution; and (c) the power to extend the general mandate mentioned in (a) above by an amount representing the aggregate number of the Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the mandate to repurchase Shares referred to in (b) above.

The above general mandates will expire at the conclusion of the 2026 AGM. At the 2026 AGM, the following resolutions, among other matters, will be proposed:

- (a) to grant the General Mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to allot, issue and otherwise deal with the Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the number of issued Shares on the date of passing of such resolution. On the assumption that 168,349,134 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2026 AGM, the maximum number of Shares to be allotted and issued pursuant to the General Mandate will be 33,669,826 (rounded down to the nearest number of Share);
- (b) to grant the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to enable them to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10% of the number of issued Shares on the date of passing of such resolution; and
- (c) to grant the Extension Mandate to the Directors to increase the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the General Mandate by an additional number representing such number of Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate.

Each of the General Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate will expire at the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next AGM following the 2026 AGM; (b) the expiration of the period with which the next AGM is required by the Articles or any applicable law of the Cayman Islands to be held; or (c) the date on which such mandate granted under this resolution is revoked or varied by ordinary resolution(s) of the Shareholders in a general meeting prior to the next AGM.

The Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to allot and issue any new Shares other than such Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of any options granted under the Share Option Scheme.

Under the GEM Listing Rules, the Company is required to give the Shareholders all information which is reasonably necessary to enable the Shareholders to make an informed

decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolution in respect of the Repurchase Mandate at the 2026 AGM. An explanatory statement for such purpose is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Under the GEM Listing Rules, the Shares which are purchased by the Company shall be automatically cancelled upon repurchase.

PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

Pursuant to 84(1) and (2) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Li Sheung Him Michael (“**Mr. Li**”) and Ms. Suen Tin Yan (“**Ms. Suen**”) shall retire from office as a Director by rotation at the 2026 AGM and being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the 2026 AGM.

The Nomination Committee has assessed and reviewed the annual written confirmation of independence from each of the independent non-executive Directors based on the independence criteria as set out in Rule 5.09 of the GEM Listing Rules and confirmed that all the independent non-executive Directors, including Ms. Suen, remain independent. Further, the Nomination Committee has also evaluated the performance of each of the retiring Directors during the year ended 31 March 2026 based on the nomination policy of the Company which was disclosed in the annual report of the Company and found their performance satisfactory. The Nomination Committee is also of the view that based on the perspectives, skills and experience of Mr. Li and Ms. Suen, they can bring further contributions to the Board and its diversity. In addition, with the nomination of the Nomination Committee, the Board has recommended that all of the retiring Directors, namely Mr. Li and Ms. Suen, stand for re-election as Directors at the 2026 AGM. Each of Mr. Li and Ms. Suen abstained from voting at the relevant Board meeting on the respective propositions of their recommendations for re-election by the Shareholders. The Board also believes that the continuous appointment of the retiring Directors contributes to the stability and diversity of the Board.

Particulars relating to the retiring Directors to be re-elected at the 2026 AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

PROPOSED RE-APPOINTMENT OF AUDITOR

The Company proposed to re-appoint Rongcheng (Hong Kong) CPA Limited as the auditor of the Company for the year ending 31 March 2027 and to hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting. A resolution will also be proposed to authorise the Board to fix the auditor’s remuneration for such year. The estimated audit fee for the audit of the consolidated financial statements of the Group for the financial year ending 31 March 2027 is expected to be in the range of approximately HK\$550,000 to HK\$600,000. The estimated audit fee represents a fair and reasonable estimation, after due consideration and arm’s length negotiation between the Company and Rongcheng (Hong Kong) CPA Limited. The estimation takes into account various factors such as the size and structure of the Group, the nature and complexity of the Group’s businesses, the expected scope, timetable and direction of the audit, the time and resources deployed by the auditor, and prevailing market rates for comparable services. Furthermore, the

estimated audit fee assumes there will be no material changes in the Group's businesses and operations, accounting policies or regulatory environment, and that the Company will provide timely and adequate assistance and information as required for the audit. The final amount of the auditor's remuneration will be further discussed and determined by the Board on a reasonable basis. In the event of any material change, the Company will make further disclosure as appropriate.

ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN

Set out on pages 16 to 20 of this circular is a notice convening the 2026 AGM at which resolutions will be proposed to approve, among other matters, the following:

- (a) the proposed grant of the General Mandate, Repurchase Mandate and Extension Mandate by ordinary resolutions;
- (b) the proposed re-election of Directors by ordinary resolutions; and
- (c) the proposed re-appointment of auditor by ordinary resolution.

If you do not attend the 2026 AGM in person but wish to exercise your right as a Shareholder, you are required to complete and return the accompanying form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Company's branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Boardroom Share Registrars (HK) Limited at Room 2103B, 21/F, 148 Electric Road, North Point, Hong Kong as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time of the 2026 AGM (i.e. by 11:00 a.m. on Sunday, 13 September 2026) or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the 2026 AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

VOTING AT THE 2026 AGM

Pursuant to Rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules, all votes of Shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. Therefore, all proposed resolutions as set out in the 2026 AGM Notice will be voted by poll. An announcement on the poll vote results will be made by the Company after the 2026 AGM in the manner prescribed under Rule 17.47(5) of the GEM Listing Rules.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board considers that the proposed grant of the General Mandate, Repurchase Mandate and Extension Mandate, the proposed re-election of Directors and proposed re-appointment of auditor at the 2026 AGM are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and recommends the Shareholders to vote in favour of such resolutions at the 2026 AGM.

To the best of the Directors' knowledge, information and belief, having made all reasonable enquiries, no Shareholders will have to abstain from voting at the 2026 AGM.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by Rule 13.08 of the GEM Listing Rules, to provide the Shareholders with all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to approve the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors.

1. GEM LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The GEM Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listings are on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their securities on the Stock Exchange and any other stock exchange on which securities of the company are listed and such exchange is recognised by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong subject to certain restrictions. Among such restrictions, the GEM Listing Rules provide that the shares of such company must be fully paid up and all repurchases of shares by such company must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of shareholders, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were a total of 168,349,134 Shares in issue.

The Repurchase Mandate will enable the Directors to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange up to a maximum of 10% of the number of issued Shares on the date of passing the relevant ordinary resolution at the 2026 AGM. Subject to the passing of the proposed resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and assuming that no Shares will be issued or repurchased prior to the 2026 AGM, the Company will be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 16,834,913 Shares (rounded down to the nearest number of Shares).

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per share and/or earnings per share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's Memorandum and Articles of Association, the Companies Act, other applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the GEM Listing Rules. A listed company may not repurchase its own securities on the Stock Exchange for a consideration other than cash or for settlement otherwise than in accordance with the trading rules of the Stock Exchange. Under the Companies Act, repurchases by the Company may only be made out of the profits of the Company or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of

Shares made for the purpose, or, if so authorised by the Articles and subject to the provisions of the Companies Act, out of capital. Any premium payable on a redemption or purchase over the par value of the Shares to be purchased must be provided for out of profits of the Company or out of the Company's share premium account, or, if so authorised by the Articles and subject to the provisions of the Companies Act, out of capital.

5. IMPACT ON WORKING CAPITAL OR GEARING LEVEL

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position as at 31 March 2026, being the date of its latest published audited consolidated financial statements, in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements or the gearing position of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. SHARE PRICES

7. UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules and applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

8. CONNECTED PERSON

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Mandate if the same is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected person (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) of the Company has notified the Company that he/she has a present intention to sell Shares, or has any such core connected person undertaken not to do so, in the event that the grant of Repurchase Mandate to the Directors is approved by the Shareholders.

9. THE TAKEOVERS CODE AND MINIMUM PUBLIC HOLDING

If on exercise of the powers of repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert (as defined in the Takeovers Code) could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

If the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full, the shareholding percentage of the following Shareholders who were interested or deemed to be interested in 5% or more of the issued Shares (based on the number of issued Shares they held as at the Latest Practicable Date) before and after the exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full would be as follows:

Note:

1. The entire issued share capital of Aperto was legally and beneficially owned by Mr. Luk. Under the SFO, Mr. Luk was deemed to be interested in all the Shares held by Aperto.

In the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full, assuming that the present shareholdings and capital structure of the Company remain the same, the shareholding interest in the Company of Aperto and the deemed shareholding interest of Mr. Luk will increase to approximately the respective percentages shown in the last column of the table above. Such increase would not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that as would give rise to such obligation. Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequence which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate or so that the number of the issued Shares in the hands of public would fall below the prescribed minimum percentage of 25% of the total number of the issued Shares.

10. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

In the six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has not repurchased any of the Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise).

The following sets out the biographical information of the Directors eligible for re-election at the 2026 AGM:

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR**Mr. Li Sheung Him Michael (李尚謙) (“Mr. Li”)**

Mr. Li, aged 42, was appointed as an executive Director on 31 May 2018. He is also a director of a number of subsidiaries of the Company. Mr. Li obtained BSc Biochemistry from Imperial College, London in September 2005 and MRes in Structural Biology from Birkbeck College, London in September 2006. From September 2007 to November 2009, Mr. Li was the business development manager of Kinetics Group in London. Since January 2010, Mr. Li has been working in the Group as a project director. Mr. Li has been appointed as an independent non-executive director of Kings Stone Holdings Group Limited (Stock code: 1943) since 11 July 2025, the shares of which is listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange.

Mr. Li has entered into a service agreement with the Company for an initial term of three years commencing from 31 May 2018 and continues thereafter until terminated in accordance with the terms of the agreement and is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election pursuant to the Articles. He is entitled to a director emolument of HK\$108,333 per month. For the year ended 31 March 2026, Mr. Li received by way of remuneration and other emoluments the amount of approximately HK\$1.4 million from the Group. Such emolument is determined annually by the Remuneration Committee with reference to his experience, responsibilities and the prevailing market conditions.
